HABBLESTHORPE CHURCHYARD

There has been some very visible progress at the Habblesthorpe Churchyard.

The paths have been fully cut back and wood chippings have been spread over them.



Old dead wood has been removed and the clearing is

almost ready to receive a new bench and sign for visitors to relax and enjoy the peace.

Many thanks to the volunteers who have come out and given up an hour on a Saturday morning - it is much appreciated. And thanks to Dave from DN22 Trees and Landscapes for providing the wood chippings.

We are looking for materials to make a base for the new bench. The base we are building will be around 8' x 4'. If you have some flags or pavers you would be willing to donate



to the cause, please get in touch.

We could also make use of some sharp sand or paver base to set the pavers onto and if anyone has any grass seed lying around that they don't need we'll take that as well.

LAND AT HABBLESTHORPE

Progress on the PC's acquisition of the waste land at Habblethorpe has been tortuous in the extreme. Dealing with the Crown's solicitors has proved to be slow, arduous and very frustrating! However, we are now pleased to report that we are entering final negotiations and hope to have secured the sale within a few weeks. Once we have taken ownership



of the land the Parish Council will refer back to previous research/

consultations and also undertake a further short period of consultation with the community to help us determine how best to bring this piece of land back into our community. It should be noted that a key covenant of the sale is that no building works will be permitted on the land – please bear this in mind when forwarding your suggestions.

ELECTIONS MAY 2023

On Thursday 4th May local elections are taking place across 230 councils in England. At these elections you will need to bring photo ID to be able to vote at a polling station. A wide range of phot ID will be accepted, including passports and driving licences and cards with a

PASS Mark.

If you don't have an accepted form of ID, you can apply for a free voter ID document known as a Voter Authority Certificate. Visit electoralcommission.org.uk voterID or call 0800 328 0280

Obviously we would like anyone who witnesses any fly tipping to inform the authorities as soon as possible with details of possible, vehicle registration numbers.

It's been a few months since we were last in touch and we wanted to give you an update on STEP, both what's been happening at site and what you might see in the coming months.

STEP news

The Government recently announced the creation of a new organization to deliver STEP – **UK Industrial Fusion Solutions Ltd** which is a big step forward for the programme. You may have also heard about the creation of new government departments over the last month. Fusion sits within the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero, demonstrating a continued high level of support across government for the development of this technology, a key part of which, of course, is STEP at West Burton.

West Burton site news

You may have already noticed drones flying over the site, this enables us to get a thorough picture of the whole site including boundaries and landforms. This work will be ongoing for the foreseeable future.

Over the coming weeks, as we head through Spring, you may see 4x4's moving around the site and people in high visibility jackets with clip boards and measuring tools. This is the start of our site characterisation work and will help us understand the flora and fauna across the site and is the very start of our environmental assessments. As part of this work we'll be installing motion activated cameras to get a full picture of the wildlife in the area.

Looking ahead, we are working out the detailed activities needed to fully understand the geology of the site and we'll share more information once we know what, and when, we'll be undertaking this work.

Next community event...

And finally, if you or anyone you know, would like to find out more about STEP and the work we're doing on site at West Burton, then please pop **Wednesday 14 June** in your diary as we'll be at the **Trinity Arts Centre in Gainsborough**. We'll send a reminder out nearer the time.

We'll be running this event a little differently to make use of the fantastic facilities at the arts centre. We will be holding some 'what is fusion?' live sessions and screening the 'STARMAKERS: the Energy of Tomorrow' film - a documentary following the lives of the engineers and scientists working at the Joint European Torus (JET) as they overcome many challenges in their attempt to achieve a world record in sustained fusion energy.
